Mrs. Crane opened the meeting once everyone signed the disclosure.

II. PUBLIC INPUT FOR ITEMS NOT LISTED ON AGENDA (3 Minute Limit)

- Bill Brown read a brief statement that expresses deep support of the 6-8 teaming model
 that is being altered by the many changes. The GEA is creating an extended anchor
 committee to address staff voices and issues as they come about. It allows students to
 successfully transition from elementary to middle school.(statement included in packet)
- Matt Collins said all staff are amazing. Pertaining to middle school and team leaders. Are there any other specific savings besides this.
- Dr. Hopson said this result is because we don't have a state budget, and assuming the GEA signs the furlough agreement there will still be teaming. All those cuts will not be made and teachers and leaders will be restored if those both happen.
- Matt Collins asked if that includes middle school.
- Dr. Hopson said it will be a model with teaming even with the change.
- Susan Rhoads read a statement thanking the school committee and administrators for their hard work. She talked about the negotiations and the furlough being asked of the teachers and paraprofessionals over the next couple of years. They want to be part of the solution. She felt they were being offered akin to extortion by being asked to a 15% furlough for 3 years. She would employ the school committee to come up with creative ways without having furloughs, do we need a full-time superintendent when Dr. Hopson retires and also that negotiations be in good faith.(statement included in packet)
- Dr. Hopson said the 6th grade will still be teamed but it will be under the elementary school administration.
- Sarah McNamara said staff is passionate with the middle school philosophy. It could be extended 5-9. The middle school teaching model is unique. Would 6th grade be temporary due to COVID.
- Dr. Hopson has no idea. Everything is temporary until we have a budget.
- Mrs. Otterbeck has been struggling with the proposal of dismantling the middle school model as we have worked very hard to make that program fabulous.
- Dr. Hopson said at this point the middle school model remains because the GEA has agreed to a furlough which covers a little more than a 10%. With the furlough we can handle up to a 12% reduction in state aid. The 6th grade will still be a teaming model.
- Dawne Piers-Gamble thanked everyone and Mrs. Papillon for the kind words at the last meeting. She is speaking as a middle school team member. This is a very difficult age span and she is concerned about getting rid of the teaming mode. Teachers train to work with students at that developmental level.
- Val Zeh said she had dreaded this year for the last 5 years, losing Sue and Dawne. It's
 a delicate dance. They operate on 236 years of experience. The middle school is losing
 160 years of experience at the middle school level. There is a physiological growth

- change students go through. They did significant professional development this year to foster lifelong learning. The DESE review said we need to stop changing in order to see an increase. They respect the school committee, but they should make all three levels be non negotiable.
- Cathy Servaes currently works in the 6th grade. She went to middle school from high school. She wants to echo what her peers have said about being on the chopping block. The middle school model is more than paying a team leader, it's common planning time, etc. She asked if they could be included in coming up with a creative solution this year to keep the middle school model and then can we look at this again next year.
- Dr. Hopson thanked everyone who has spoken. He taught for 19 years before he came here. If nothing else changed we would be in perfect shape - it will be years before we recover from this. We are looking to maintain the district. As part of the MOU we agreed to expand the process of having people meet with administrators. We have no idea what is going to happen and until now we had no reason to have a big group get together. We had an unknown.
- Jason Forgue said in response to Susan Rhoads, he has the utmost respect for all teachers here. The statement of extortion he takes exception to. When we voted to go ahead with the up to 15% furlough it was to keep from making any cuts. He too feels like the attack is on the teachers sometimes but not to the extent of extortion tactics. In ways to save money he has gone over the budget and had about 17 questions about how we could save. As far as a full- time superintendent, all options are open. He agrees it is too large a salary and we need to come up with another way. He gets the impression they are all adminit about keeping the middle mode. It is not an attack, it is more of a current faculty and assessment to make this move. We are all doing our best to come up with creative alternatives.
- Peter Curro worked at Gateway for 33 years when he retired as the middle school principal. He went to the town meeting and there wasn't any budget information. He has spent the last five years as the middleman working with schools and with Westfield University. In addition to middle school teaming he has worked in high schools where 9th grade has been teamed. Teaming is important to the whole child but it's also a culture that brings out a more positive tone than lack of teaming. Learning in a supportive environment so when they try new ideas as they are conceptual learners gives an opportunity to take a risk and make a mistake in a safe place where they won't crash and burn. He hopes that someday the middle school can be put back together. He would love to be part of the superintendent search.
- Mrs. Garfield said with the savings from the furlough, why would the 6th grade still have to be moved to the elementary.
- Dr. Hopson said we have to plan that there will be financial cuts if not this year, but next year. He doesn't know how many teachers won't show up due to underlying health issues, getting kids to school, and specials, (hopefully state will come through),but at this point it is planning for the future.
- Mrs. McVeigh said in listening to the public input, she would like to understand how many teachers were involved in this plan.
- Dr. Hopson said no teachers were involved in the initial plan.

- Mrs. McVeigh suggested he take a serious look at involving the teachers as he moves forward. They should be able to nominate people to the group.
- Dr. Hopson said we have already put that process in place.

III. STUDENT COUNCIL INPUT

• Brian Fourgue said they are full on in summer vacation mode. He believes he was in 7th grade when they closed the hallway that is now used for the preschool. He does remember having all those teachers around emotionally and that he loved everyone. He was never in need of the social emotion support. He agrees with Mrs. McVeigh we need to make sure the teachers are involved in the decisions that are being made. Even little changes like moving Mr. Brown to English. He is so helpful to the teachers. The teachers understand their mental health very well and need to be included in future negotiations.

- Christine Dame is a parent and part of the school council and is happy to know the
 middle school model will remain. Her child has had a positive experience in both
 schools and feels the middle school was good to both her students. She hopes it would
 remain as is under the same administration as her daughter was 5-8 and it was
 personally better for her daughter.
- Dr. Hopson was hoping the commissioner and the governor would have something to say yesterday, but they did not.
- Mr. Crane is disappointed that they didn't have anything to say.
