III. STUDENT COUNCIL INPUT

- Brennan Foley wanted to work and talk about the high school and promote what goes on. He made a video showing the departments, clubs, and sports offered at Gateway. The video was played. Graduation is June 3rd. Eight seniors just got back from Disney. It was hot, humid and fun. Cirque was the highlight of the trip for him. Spring fling was last Friday. They had volleyball, face painting, marshmallow guns, popcorn, cotton candy etc. Senior exams end on Friday. The awards ceremony is Wednesday. This year the spirit trophy is going to the freshmen. The sports banquet is next Tuesday. The senior banquet is next Wednesday.

IV. PRESENTATIONS/REPORTS/RECOGNITIONS

A. National School Lunch Program

- Mrs. McCaul said we have to vote whether we want to participate or not. We actually have to approve it because that is where our money comes from. They are using less processed foods with lower sodium and fat levels. The new term is clean. The café is using more produce and is still involved in farm to school program. She just received the last apple shipment. The Café is receiving entitlement dollars from the Department of Defense. She will double her budget with the DOD Program. It runs from October through April. We received and extra \$800 bonus. Our numbers are up for direct certifications for SNAP, transitional assistance and Medicaid. We are in the nearly eligible category. You have to have 40% of your school have directed certifications. The new child authorization bill is going to up the eligibility factors to 60%.
- The paid lunch equity bill says we have to charge kids accordingly. She has to increase lunch prices this
 year in order to stay in compliance. As far as the realignment of schools, the elementary schools are fine.
 The change will be here in the high school. They will go from three lunches to two lunches. This will
 result in reduced staff hours.
- We have a loose charging policy. Computerized bills are sent out to parents on Fridays. We can't carry bad debt from one year to the next year.
- The wellness policy implementation committee is in its 10th year. We have gone from candy bar sales to fruit sales, plant sales, candle sales, etc. We are on the right track.
- Mr. Wyand asked the amount of our unrecovered debt.
- Mrs. McCaul said 5-12 we are down to \$300. Elementary is at\$700. Chester was a bit better this year.
- Ms. Fisk said the café can't carry it. We would carry it in the general fund.
